



Daffodil Planting Guide

About Daffodils

Daffodil bulbs are a snap to plant and require only minimum effort and time. They are a fall-planted bulb that will provide years of beautiful mid-spring bloom.

When to Plant

You can comfortably plant daffodil bulbs from September through December.

Where to Plant

Daffodils prefer sunlight, but will tolerate a good bit of shade as well. Choose a spot with rich, well-draining soil. A little dampness is fine, but do not plant daffodil bulbs at a site that attracts standing water for prolonged periods of time.

How to Plant

Plant bulbs about 4-5 inches apart and 6 inches deep. Though it is advisable to plant daffodil bulbs in groups of at least 30, do not crowd the bulbs too close together as this may inhibit future growth. After planting, supplement the existing soil with a rich top soil to stimulate propagation. The use of a fertilizer is recommended, but not necessary.

Caring for Daffodils

Once planted, water the site regularly, being careful not to overwater. After bloom in spring, wait until the foliage has turned brown before cutting or trimming. Be sure not to cut the foliage too early, as this will possibly inhibit future growth.
