



Mexican Tuberose Planting Guide

About Mexican Tuberose

Tuberose flowers are wonderfully scented perennial flowers that are popular in many different parts of the world. The flowers have long been used in the perfume industry and it's easy to see (or smell) why. Waxy white clusters of flowers bloom at night, inviting you to take an after-dinner constitutional through the garden.

When to Plant

Plant Tuberose in the spring after danger of the last frost has passed. Mexican tuberose cannot tolerate frost.

Where to Plant

Look for a location with well-draining soil and full sun.

How to Plant

Plant Tuberose bulbs 2-4" deep. If you want concentrated areas of tuberose, plant bulbs 8-10" apart.

Caring for Mexican Tuberose

Tuberoses are easy to grow and maintain. Simply keep an eye on when they need watering. We recommend around 1 inch of water per week if there are not regular rains. Don't cut your foliage off at the end of the season-let it yellow so the plant can still receive nutrients.
