



Statice Planting Guide

About Statice

Statice is so popular to the dried flower market! Growing up to 24," this annual puts out a rainbow of colors including blue, purple, shades of yellow and rose, and white.

When to Plant

Direct Sow Statice seeds outdoors after the threat of frost has passed in the spring. Statice seeds can also be started indoors 8-10 weeks before the final frost date.

Where to Plant

Choose an area with full sun exposure to get your Statice plants to thrive. This variety does best in average, well-drained, loamy soil - if your planting area is heavy clay, you'll either need to do significant amendment, or consider growing Statice in containers.

How to Plant

Sow Statice seeds directly onto the surface of the soil, and compress firmly. Do not cover the seeds, as they require sunlight in order to germinate. Seedlings will sprout in 21-30 days.

Caring for Statice

Once seedlings are approximately 2" tall, thin to 1 plant every 18". Once established, Statice needs little watering or care, and is drought-resistant. If Statice stalks begin to droop, support, such as a grow-through ring, can help stabilize them. Once they die back from the fall frost, remove your Statice from the growing area.
