



Veronica Planting Guide

About Veronica

Veronica, also called speedwell, is a carefree and easy-to-grow perennial with long spiked of small petals in purple, blue, pink, or white. The gorgeous flowers grow in clusters from 1-3' tall, and blooms from spring to autumn.

When to Plant

Plant after the danger of frost has passed in early spring.

Where to Plant

Veronica performs best in full sun, in average, medium moisture, well-drained soils. It can tolerate partial shade if needed. Its best performance occurs with consistent moisture combined with sharp soil drainage.

How to Plant

Loosen the soil and mix in compost. Dig a hole twice the diameter of the plant's container. When placing the plant in the hole, ensure the top of the root ball is level with the soil surface. Water thoroughly.

Caring for Veronica

Water in summer if rainfall is less than 1" per week. Keep covered with a thin layer of compost, followed by a 2" layer of mulch to retain moisture. Deadhead your plants to extend the bloom time. After the first killing frost, cut back stems to 1-2" above the soil line. Divide perennials in autumn or spring every few years.
