



Blazing Star Planting Guide

About Blazing Star

Blazing Star is an attractive, hardy perennial that is great for containers or cut flowers. It's known for its grass-like foliage and tall, spiky purple blooms that beckon pollinators. Low maintenance, and easy to grow, blazing star will do well in the hot summer days while other plants wilt.

When to Plant

Plant in the spring, as soon as the soil is workable and the danger of frost has passed.

Where to Plant

Select an area that receives full sun, with rich, well-draining soil.

How to Plant

Prepare your area by spreading 2 inches of compost over the area and dig the compost into the top 6-8 inches of soil. Dig a 6-inch-deep hole for each corm. Space the holes 12-15 inches apart in all directions. Set each Corm at a 3" depth, with its flat side on the bottom and fill in the hole with soil. Water the bed lightly so the soil is moist but not saturated.
